**Brief on the session**

The social and economic impact of technology in the world is widespread and accelerating. The speed and volume of digital information being transmitted have increased exponentially.

Experts are predicting that 90% of the world's entire population will be connected to the Internet within 10 years. The risks are also real for young people and children in particular. Our students use Internet and mobile technologies to explore the world and connect to it, to create everything from identities to content and to learn in ways that are unprecedented - both inside and outside the classroom. Are schools, students and teachers ready for this integration? If you ask schools what is "digital literacy" you will probably get 100 different answers. In this talk, we will introduce the concept of Digital Intelligence (DQ). Just like IQ and EQ our children will need to work on building their DQ skills i.e. screen time management, managing cyber-bullying, creating positive digital footprints and navigating safely on the web. We will look at strategies for fostering these skills in schools to ensure our children are digital leaders of tomorrow.

Mounira is a co-founder and CEO of Emkan Education. She worked as a Senior Research Specialist with the Ideation Center, Booz & Company's think tank in the Middle East. She was leading the Ideation Center's research efforts on education, women's studies, youth development and evolving social issues that have important implications for the Middle East region. She also worked as Assistant Governor for National Qualifications and Advisor in the Public Education Evaluation Commission in Saudi Arabia and she lectures and teaches on a part time basis.
